

NEW VS. USED: MAKING THE RIGHT VEHICLE CHOICE



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1. New Engine

a. Cost

Buying a brand-new engine for a 2010 Ford F-150 will hit your wallet hard. The engine alone can run over \$4,000, and that's before labor. Trucks like the F-150 typically cost more than smaller cars when it comes to engine replacement. Add labor (which can be another \$2,000+), and you're staring down a total bill close to \$7,000 or \$8,000. That includes things like fluids, belts, mounts, sensors, and small parts you can't skip.

b. Depreciation Effect

Swapping in a new engine doesn't reset the time that you have been running your or make your F-150 "new" again. Buyers still look at the full mileage and wear. The frame, body, transmission, suspension—they're still 2010 parts. A new engine might help it sell faster, but it won't raise its resale value by much.

c. Warranty

New engines typically come with solid coverage—around 3 years or 36,000 miles, depending on the source. But here's the catch: warranty only covers the engine itself. Labor is usually covered only if the install is done by a certified shop or dealer. And that shop may or may not be in your nearby area. Any mistake during install & the warranty's void. Always read the warranty terms before you spend a dime.

2. Used Engine

a. Cost

Used engines are way more affordable. You can find a tested, solid used engine for a 2010 F-150 in the \$1,200–\$2,500 range. Labor stays roughly the same. So, all in, you're usually looking at \$4,000–\$5,000 max. That's a few grand less than going new. For most truck owners, this is the only move that makes sense.

b. Depreciation Effect

Like with a new engine, swapping in a used engine won't change the truck's resale number much. It's not about resale—it's about keeping your truck running. If you plan to keep it and haul, tow, or use it as a daily workhorse, a used engine is a cost-effective fix.

c. Warranty

Some used engines come with a short warranty—30, 60, 90 days. Occasionally, you'll find 6-month or 1-year coverage, especially if it was tested, rebuilt, or came from a reliable supplier. Oil, coolant, or fuel leaks? Fix them immediately. Small leaks turn into expensive repairs—fast.

- **Good Quality Fluids**

Use the fluids your F-150 was designed for. Don't mix brands or specs. Bad fluid choices hurt sensors and seals.

- **Drive Gently**

Let your truck warm up. Don't mash the pedal cold. Avoid idling it daily. Push it only when the engine is ready.

- **Use Correct Parts**

Stick to OEM or well-reviewed aftermarket brands. Cheap sensors and plugs trigger false codes and misfires.

- **Listen to the Engine**

Your ears are your best tool. If it starts knocking, ticking, whining—check it. Noise means something's off.
